

Non-Competitive Grant-in-Aid

The Non-Competitive Grant-in-Aid program supports new and ongoing research costs for members of the Ordinary Faculty on the Main Campus. A total of \$25,000 is available each fiscal year for individual faculty awards not exceeding \$300 for use during the fiscal year in which the award is made. Applications for support will be accepted through June 29th as long as funds remain available for that fiscal year. **Faculty may request no more than \$300 per fiscal year.**

ELIGIBILITY: All members of the Ordinary Faculty on the Main Campus are eligible to apply; MSB Faculty not eligible.

PURPOSES: Funds may be used for research materials, conference registration fees, costs for research assistance, and subventions for scholarly manuscripts. As the research needs of the faculty are various, requests for support for other research-related purposes also will be considered. Due to resource limitations, however, requests for support of travel to conferences cannot be considered.

APPLICATION: Faculty should complete an application via the Graduate School's Internal Proposal Routing System (IPRS). Please note that you will be required to attach an updated CV and a short description of how the funds would be used if approved.

Chairs/program directors will be notified via e-mail of the request but need not provide an endorsement or letter of support.

Please note that you will be asked to identify a specific cost center into which the award should be transferred; in general, awards cannot be transferred into "GX" (general operating fund) accounts but rather into a "GD" (general discretionary fund).

DEADLINE: Applications accepted on a rolling basis through June 29th of the 2009-10 fiscal year (the fiscal year runs from July 1st of the current year through June 30th of the following year) as funds permit.
